The Bureau of Land Management Farmington Field Office, in coordination with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, has prepared a joint Draft Resource Management Plan Amendment and Environmental Impact Statement (RMPA/EIS) to analyze and update resource management issues around Chaco Culture National Historical Park. The 90-day public comment and review period began on February 28, 2020.
